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TCMS PRESIDENT'S LETTER

May was a very eventful month. Graduation and moves for residency, the end of masks for fully vaccinated adults, opening pediatric groups to vaccinations, the steady decline of COVID-19 cases in Oklahoma and a start of a new normal. In Tulsa, we have recognized the awful events of 100 years ago with the recognition of the tragedy of the Tulsa Race Riots. Fortunately, we have been able to come together as a community and look back at the horrors of those events. I have no doubt in the future we can heal as a community and become stronger. Tulsa is truly a world class city. The future always improves when we can address both the positives and negatives of our past.

The end of spring also brings an end to the Oklahoma Legislative session as always, many issues that OSMA and TCMS supported were successful and many were not.

The Oklahoma Legislature defeated many scope of practice measures including PA supervision from an unlimited number of physicians, psychologists to be considered providers similar to physicians, physical therapists expansion in regards to diagnosis and development of treatment protocols, and nurse specialists independent prescriptive authority.

The Legislature also took notice of telehealth with passage of a pay parity bill for telehealth services. And the OKSHINE that maintains a digital platform for sharing and exchanging health related information.

The increasing costs of multiple co-pays was addressed with passage of the co-pay accumulator legislation recalculation of out of pocket pharmaceutical costs so the unfortunate and

increasingly common practice of asking for multiple co-pays can be minimized. Transparency in Health Care Pricing Act passed and I wholeheartedly support as the absolutely insane pricing of healthcare must stop. The continual wholesale motivation to take advantage of patients in hindsight is one of the most tragic developments in the past 20 years. We cannot continue to prey upon patients and force bankruptcy because one side hides the prices or knows the rules and the patients do not. Too many patients now avoid medical care out of a fear of unknown costs.

Medicaid Managed Care was a huge topic of this legislative session I believe Governor Stitt was misinformed when he decided that managed care contracts

for Medicaid could shift the cost and get the government out of healthcare. However, the compromise is that a bill that passed without the Governors signature that added requirements for Medicaid Managed Care including concerns of the medical community: these included clean claims processed in 14 days, minimum reimbursement equal to 1/1/21 Medicaid, scorecard requirements, uniform review and appeal processes, and peer to peer for denials. However the biggest victory is now these requirements must be readdressed annually and as problems arise there is a process to rectify.

I leave this review with a sincere hope that as a healthcare community we will take time to have a bite with a colleague or a smile even under a mask. We all have to heal after the past year a little extra time to hear a story or slow down just a little is time well spent we have spent too much time away.

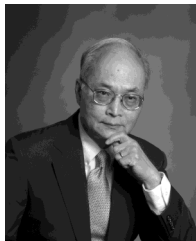
